What activities were undertaken and why?

Officers visited Community Forums, local meetings and libraries to speak to members of the public about what makes a good quality of life. A competition in Derbyshire's Insight Magazine also asked people to tell us 'what makes Derbyshire special?'

Surveys and questionnaires reveal what is important to local people but a variety of reasons may influence their choices. The idea of this consultation was to peel back the layers and get people talking openly and honestly to develop a better understanding of local priorities and use the feedback to help shape future plans, strategies and projects (e.g. the Derbyshire Sustainable Community Strategy and partners' own corporate plans). People were specifically asked what is important to their quality of life to open the discussion and then chose their top priorities.

Comments:	Residents felt that a greater police presence and CCTV could help to reduce the fear of crime in Alfreton and they felt crime hindered community cohesion and activities as people were afraid to go out at night. Parks and open spaces was seen to be a priority so that children had safe places to play near their homes. Residents also raised truancy as an issue and wanted better use of truancy officers. They also felt that parents needed more support with difficult children.

Comments:	<p>Affordable decent housing was chosen as a priority because of the cost of private sector housing for first time buyers. There was a concern about the shortage of council houses as they had been bought by tenants. More housing would mean more open space was needed and this should be considered in the planning process. Residents also felt that the World Heritage corridor should be developed for walkers. Residents felt that the fear of crime was a larger issue than crime itself, but a visible police presence and more activities for teenagers could improve that. They saw supporting neighbourhood watch schemes and reclaiming the streets as a positive way forward.</p>

Comments:	<p>With an aging population in Heanor, supporting people to live independently was thought to be a priority. Care providers should take this into consideration during service planning but community organisations could also play a role. More publicity about services available would be beneficial. Residents felt that street cleaning should be extended outside of the town centre. They also thought that more social housing was needed but care should be taken by planners regarding access to services. Another high priority was the town centre, which people felt needed to be revamped.</p>

Comments:	Residents chose health as a priority as there was a problem with access to doctors and dentists in Ripley. People wanted better health and leisure facilities and an open doctor's surgery on Saturdays. There was thought to be a problem of teenagers hanging around on the streets and more activities could prevent this. This had an impact on crime and anti-social behaviour. They also felt that parents should be held accountable for their children's behaviour and schools needed to teach respect. With respect to recycling, residents felt that business rates for recycling should be reduced as there was currently no financial incentive. They also wanted a wider range of materials to be collected.

Comments:	Residents felt that there should be more activities available to children and young people. They wanted more after school clubs and thought the community centre could be used for youth activities. There were links here to crime, which was also a concern, but they felt that individuals needed to report all crime and the police needed to respond to all reported crimes. They felt that certain local roads were dangerous and wanted more enforcement of highway laws. This was of major concern to residents who wanted speed limits reduced, young drivers educated about speeding and road signs cleaned.

Comments:	<p>We were unable to attend community forum events in Bolsover, however we arranged and attended other events in the district.</p> <p>Many people highlighted reducing crime and anti-social behaviour as a priority. Safety was seen as an issue, with people feeling unsafe on the streets and some even in their own home. There was a link made between young people and anti-social behaviour, and many commented that there should be more done to tackle alcohol and drug abuse in children and young people. There were also many comments regarding activities for children and young people. Residents felt that providing more activities, there would be a reduction in anti-social behaviour and also help to provide motivation through recreation and interaction with other young people and members of the community.</p> <p>Access to services was seen to be of particular importance to the elderly and disabled. There was a comment made that there was a split in Bolsover town with the top having many amenities and the bottom (Carr Vale) having very little. People commented that to have a good community spirit you needed local people to work together to organise community events. They also felt it was important that their views were listened and supported by public sector organisations. There were many comments regarding bus services in the area and the need to provide more regular and reliable public transport links. In particular comments were made about links to Chesterfield. Other comments highlighted issues with parking enforcement in the area.</p>

Comments:	<p>We were unable to attend the forums in Chesterfield but went along to the forum event at the Winding Wheel in October to collect thoughts from forum attendees and also spoke to people in Chesterfield Library.</p> <p>Public transport was discussed, with many people commenting on the need for better bus services but also the need to bring back the trams and trolley buses in Chesterfield. People felt public transport should be subsidised to encourage people to leave their cars at home and that cycle routes should be extended and improved.</p> <p>Many felt that activities for children and young people were important to give them the best opportunities in life as residents felt that positive activities would build confidence and ability. Some thought that children would benefit from interaction with other children and other members of the community for example via intergenerational activities. Links were made between young people and anti-social behaviour and comments were made that young people drinking on the streets was a real problem. Residents also wanted to see a greater police presence and felt this would make people feel safer when they were outside.</p> <p>Litter and rubbish on the street was thought to be a real issue. Some suggested that penalties for dropping litter and fly tipping should be better enforced. In addition a stronger sense of community would result in pride in the local area and encourage people to look after their neighbourhood more. Affordable decent housing and activities for adults came joint fifth as priorities. People felt affordable housing was</p>

	<p>especially important in the current economic climate and also encourages local people to be able to stay in the area. Activities for adults came up as a priority, many people who cited this were in the 50+ age group, they felt active but lonely and wanted more to do in their old age than sitting at home watching TV.</p>

Comments:	<p>Many people commented on the condition of the roads stating that many of the roads are in a hazardous condition, not helped by high levels of traffic congestion in the area. There were also issues around lack of parking and people parking on the pavement. There was a feeling that there was not enough investment in youth activities with the loss of local facilities and mobile youth facilities did not meet local needs. The residents felt that there was a problem retaining skilled workers and young people to work in the area as the cost of local housing was so high. Improving health and well-being was seen as important, but the responsibility lay with individuals to eat well and exercise regularly.</p>

Comments:	<p>There were many comments about highways, roads and transport, with the majority raising the issue of congestion in Ashbourne town centre in particular. Some people suggested a bypass, with others commenting that decent infrastructure is a priority in many areas. Residents wanted improvements to waste collection with weekly collections and doorstep plastic recycling. Affordable decent housing was seen as a priority as it was essential for keeping young and local people in the area. With an aging population in the Derbyshire Dales district, many agreed that supporting people to live independently was a priority in the area. There needed to be more support to the elderly and their carers to assist people to stay in their own homes for as long as possible.</p>

Comments:	Residents felt that agency-led activities with support from local volunteers could encourage children and young people to get involved and keep them out of trouble, especially in the winter. More needs to be done to publicise existing youth activities to all young people. Residents were concerned that the lack of affordable housing was forcing young people to move away from the area, resulting in an older age profile. Many people felt that tackling climate change would have a big impact on other priorities, in particular highways, roads and transport and reduce, re-use, recycle. There were concerns about what would happen to the Pavilion in Matlock. Residents didn't want another pub or nightclub but would prefer a youth club or sports hall.

Comments:	<p>There were lots of comments regarding crime and personal safety with many believing that street safety could be improved. Regarding health and wellbeing, it was felt that education was essential to help encourage people to make healthier choices. It was felt that there was a need for better social housing and that new housing needed to be thought out so that it had community facilities. Clean streets were seen as very important by many. It was felt that clean streets imbued a sense of pride in where you live and that street cleanliness could be improved. Finally, a decent education was all was seen as important, with emphasis on the need for more apprenticeships.</p>
